# Keeping the Dream Alive in 2009



The AABE Atlanta Chapter and Georgia Power Company's (GPC) Energy Exchange organization celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day Celebration on January 21st in GPC's Arkwright Auditorium. The program featured opening remarks by Energy Exchange President Timothy Bolden and AABE Atlanta VP Eric Arnold. Sonya Lewis sang the National Anthem to the captive audience.

AABE Board member Richard

Holmes, SVP of GPC, was the lead speaker. Richard talked about what the MLK Day of Service meant to him. He mentioned that President Ronald Reagan made the 3rd Monday of January a national holiday. He also talked about how Senators Harry Crawford of Pennsylvania and John Lewis of Georgia crafted legislation to make the holiday a national day of service. Richard also discussed how the GPC motto "A Citizen Wherever We Serve" parallels Dr. King's philosophy about being a leader means that you have to be able to serve others first.

AABE member Lamont Houston, GPC's SVP of Customer Service & Sales, discussed how the inauguration of the US 44th President Barack Obama is the fulfillment of Dr. King's dream and if race still matters in this day and age. Lamont mentioned the principles of how this country was founded based on equality, prosperity and the pursuit of happiness. He also mentioned how segregation based on race is an economic construct that can be undone.

Mike Garrett, President and CEO of GPC thanked the 800 GPC employees that were involved in the Day of Service programs across the state. He stated that "freedom rang yesterday" as Obama became President and that he is a man "we can all rally around."

At the end of the program, Mr. Garrett awarded the Southern Style Excellence Award to Bill Maddox of GPC's Metro TMC-Oakley.


formally introduce its new board members at their annual meeting on March 23rd at the Crowne Plaza Ravina Hotel.

# In the Pipeline: Georgia Energy News

Senator Don Balfour (R-Snellville) introduced a bill to the GA Legislature in January that would let Georgia Power (GPC) charge customers early for the interest costs of building two nuclear reactors near Augusta. GPC and other power companies expect to begin construction in 2011. The GPC share of costs is \$6.4B. The total cost of the project is \$14B. The GA PSC is scheduled to decide on this

decision in March.


# Biofuel Pipeline to Serve Southeast US

Kinder Morgan Energy Partners successfully tested a project to transport 20,000 barrels of biodiesel fuel through the Plantation Pipeline system according to a January 21st report filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Previously, biofuels shipments could only be transported by truck or train because of contamination and corrosion issues associated with ethanol and biodiesel through pipelines. The pipeline runs through northern Georgia from Louisiana to Virginia. Kinder Morgan plans to use a segment of the pipeline from Collins, MS to Spartanburg, SC for transporting a blend of biodiesel fuel. The fuel will

then be delivered by truck to Charlotte & Greensboro, NC and finally Roanoke, VA.

Kinder Morgan identified a proprietary additive that prevents ethanol from damaging steel used as pipe. Commercial operation begins within 30 to 60 days on a limited basis. Full operation will be available in the 4th quarter of 2009. 🌣
