Lewis Latimer – (member of Edison Pioneers, Menlo Park, NJ) patented in 1882

<u>Inventor of Automatic Engine</u> <u>Lubricator:</u>

Elijah McCoy (AKA "The Real McCoy") – (Founder of Elijah McCoy Manufacturing Company, Detroit, MI) patented in 1915, company founded in 1920

Expert in Particle Physics and Electricity Conduction:

Shirley Jackson – (Theoretical Physicist at Bell Labs, Murray Hill, NJ) 1976

NATIONAL ENERGY NEWS: U.S. State of the Union Address -

Live on television and in front of Congress, U.S. President **George W. Bush** is quoted in his Wednesday, January 24th State of the Union speech on the topic of energy policy as saying, "For too long our nation has been dependent on foreign oil...It is in our vital interest to diversify America's energy supply – and the way forward is through technology, ...reduce gasoline usage by 20% in the next ten years, ... and alternative energy sources. They will help us to confront the serious challenge of global climate change."

Energy an Issue for Businesses

More than 90% of venture capitalists surveyed by the National Venture Capital Association rated investing in energy companies the most popular for 2007. Investing in internet and media companies are numbers two and three respectively. Increasing U.S. supplies of oil, natural gas and developing alternative energy sources is the top legislative priority of the *National* Association of Manufacturers to lobby during the new 110th Congressional session. Large corporations and small business owners both say energy and fuel costs have the most impact on their business. CFOs surveyed by the Association of Financial Professionals and the small business owners surveyed by International Profit Associates Small Business Research Board both say they are worried that high energy costs could inhibit growth in 2007.
