AABE ATLANTA CHAPTER MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS:

AABE Atlanta August Meeting



The Chapter held its monthly meeting on August 14th at GPC on the topic of "Future Career Demands in the Energy Sector." Guest speakers for the event are pictured above from left to right: **Jerome Richard**, Sourcing Strategist for SCS and **Ira Pearl**, VP of Engineering & Construction for AGL.

The panelists provided a "macroscopic" and "microscopic" view of the changing job environment and what skills that professionals need to have and cultivate in the current job market.

AABE Member Jerome Richard, an HR professional at Georgia Power/SCS, provided the "bird's eye" view. AABE member Ira Pearl, VP at AGL, offered his insights on what hiring managers are looking for more specifically.

The panelists stressed that diversity is increasingly important in recruiting. An employer has to have an environment that supports diversity and makes people feel welcome, and likewise it is important for employees to continue to sharpen their skills so that they bring a diverse set of talents to the workplace.

Ira stated that his organization is looking not only for smart people, but people who have soft skills such as leadership and also professional maturity. He stated that approximately 40% of his hires over the last two years have been women, in part because women often are more mature earlier in their careers.

Both agreed it was important for a professional to match his skills to the employer rather than taking a position for money or prestige. The type of organization, whether it is a smaller company or large corporation, is another consideration.

Minority Businesses Get Enterprising – (AGL Daily News 8/19/08)



Minority business owners can develop their companies by focusing on building coalitions, **Ralph Cleveland**, (pictured) SVP of Engineering & Operations, AGL Resources, told attendees at a recent networking reception sponsored by AGL Resources for the Georgia Minority Business Enterprise Center. The center is a division of Georgia Tech's Enterprise Innovation Institute.

In what he called "social entrepreneurship," Ralph reminded the participants of the importance of making new contacts and following up on those meetings to build relationships.

The highlight of the evening was a "guided networking" session:
The 86 participants were divided into groups according to their color-coded badges and then encouraged to introduce themselves to people they did not know by exchanging business cards and giving short descriptions of their companies. Each participant then had to answer four questions designed to build relationships quickly:

- How did you start your business?
- Where is your hometown?
- What is your favorite TV program?
- What is the best book you have read in the past year and why?

The session also gave people the opportunity to discover five things they had in common and answer creative questions about motivation and expertise.

"This was a little different from the center's usual financial roundtable," says **Tarece Hassell**, Manager, AGL's Supplier Diversity Department. "This was a powerful evening of relationship building with the ultimate goal of helping minority business owners do business with each other."

The Green Workplace: Vehicle Promotes Environmental Benefits of Natural Gas – (AGL Daily News 8/21/08)



When guests arrived this week for a reception of the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce at Ten Peachtree Place, a sporty Honda Civic dressed in AGL Resources' colors was parked in front of the building -- the latest tool in AGL Resources' campaign to promote the environmental benefits of natural gas.

The vehicle is fueled by compressed natural gas (CNG), and employees will drive the eyecatching car when they attend highly visible business functions in metro Atlanta. **Nichole Miles**, Manager, Fleet Services, conducted several training sessions on operating and refueling procedures for employees.

"We believe that the timing is right to aggressively pursue a compressed natural gas vehicle strategy," says **John Somerhalder**, Chairman,

President and CEO. "Gasoline and diesel prices are at unprecedented levels, and consumers are increasingly committed to the environment.

We want to continue to be seen as a leader in innovative energy policy, and the car will help draw attention to the important role of natural gas."

Natural gas vehicles emit fewer greenhouse gases than gasoline-

fueled vehicles, and they are less expensive to operate:

Greenhouse gases reductions of a natural gas vehicle over a gasoline vehicle:

GPC Files for Biomass Plant

Georgia Power Company (GPC) has asked the Georgia Public Service Commission (GPSC) for approval to convert coal-fueled Plant Mitchell to renewable wood biomass. Upon conversion, GPC Plant Mitchell would be capable of producing 96 megawatts (MW) of renewable energy. The plant would have lower emissions, and would be one of the largest wood biomass plants in the United States. It would also have lower fuel and operating costs when compared to continued operation using coal, thereby making the plant more cost-effective for customers. If the conversion is approved by the GPSC, wood fuel for Plant Mitchell would come from suppliers operating within an approximately 100-mile radius of the plant.

First GA Corn-Based Ethanol Plant near Opening – (Atlanta Business Chronicle 8/22/08)

First United Ethanol LLC, Georgia's 1st corn-based ethanol plant will open for business on October 9th. First United will operate on a 268-acre site in Mitchell County near Albany, GA. Annual production capacity is 100 million gallons.

Appeals Court to hear Power Plant Case – (Atlanta Business Chronicle 8/22/08)

The Georgia Court of Appeals agreed on August 20th to review a lower court ruling that has halted plans for the state's first coalfired power plant in more than 20 years. At issue is whether the GA Environmental Protection Division should place legal limits on emissions of carbon dioxide by the planned \$2 billion Longleaf Energy Station in SW Georgia. The plant is a project of Houston-based Dynegy Inc.

In June, Fulton County **Superior Court Judge Thelma** Wyatt Cummings Moore ruled in favor of the Sierra Club that the permits are invalid because they don't regulate CO2 which has been linked to global warming. "This ruling is a threat to affordable energy and economic development throughout Georgia," said Georgia Chamber of Commerce President & CEO, George Israel. The Chamber has submitted a brief in support of Dynegy to appeal the decision.

U.S. ENERGY NEWS:

Federal Government Seeks
Comments on Outer
Continental Shelf Gas
Exploration by Sept. 15th



Every five years, the U.S. Minerals Management Service (MMS), the government agency responsible for oil and gas leasing in U.S. offshore waters, develops a Five Year Plan. That plan determines where and how often oil and gas lease sales will occur over the five year period.

As part of the regulatory process, the MMS has issued a call for information and will accept comments regarding the public's interests and concerns over offshore oil and gas development through September 15, 2008. Jumpstarting a new Five Year Program that could potentially accelerate the development of offshore oil and gas wells in areas that were labeled off-limits by the President and Congress. Currently, more than 80 percent of our nation's offshore resources are labeled off-limits for exploration.

Starting the process now could give the next administration a two-year advance in developing and expanding offshore energy production in federal waters. If Congress agrees to lift restrictions on offshore development, a new Five Year Plan could play a critical role in increasing the nation's supply of oil and natural gas and making energy more affordable. As part of our General Energy Principles, AABE recognizes that access to reliable and affordable energy is essential to low- and fixed income households, is an important element for sustaining business development and economic growth, and thus supports efforts to enhance U.S. energy development.

<u>Is Gustav the Brother of</u> Katrina? – (zFacts.com 8/28/08)



August 29th marked the 3-year anniversary when Hurricane Katrina breached the levees in New Orleans, flooded the city and leveled the surrounding areas in several states along the Gulf of Mexico. We are now facing the wrath of Hurricane Gustay, in which the National Ocean and Atmosphere Association (NOAA) recorded as a category 3 storm that hit Louisiana. Subsequently, Hurricane Hanna also formed over Puerto Rico on Thursday, August 28th and is approaching South Carolina, Florida and Georgia. NOAA is also watching Tropical Storm Ike form over the mid-Atlantic and three other potential weather depressions (names: Josephine, Karina and unknown at this time).

Emergency preparations are underway in NO, LA and Biloxi, MS, who are still rebuilding from Katrina. "We don't need anything of this magnitude over here," said **Biloxi Mayor A.J. Holloway**, "Katrina just devastated us."

The oil market also reacted to the threat. Oil prices jumped above \$119 a barrel as workers began to evacuate from the offshore rigs responsible for a quarter of U.S. crude production. Any damage to the oil infrastructure or Gulf Coast refineries could send U.S. pump prices spiking, possibly during the busy Labor Day weekend.

"A bad storm churning in the Gulf could be a nightmare scenario," said **Phil Flynn**, an analyst at Alaron Trading Corp. in Chicago. "We might see oil

prices spike \$5 to \$8 if it really rips into platforms."

Is America ready for round 2? Are we anticipating the worst? We can only wait and see.

Black History Energy Moments

September 2, 1833 – Ohio's Oberlin College, the 1st US college to routinely enroll Black students, is founded.

September 4, 1848 – Inventor **Lewis H. Latimer** was born.

September 4, 1957 – **Arkansas Governor Orval Faubus** calls out the National Guard to bar Black students from entering a Little Rock high school.

September 7, 1954 – Integration of public schools begins in Washington, DC and Baltimore, MD.

September 9, 1915 – **Carter G. Woodson** founds the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History.

September 10, 1929 – **Elbert Stallworth** patents the electrically heated chamber pot.

September 15-20, 1830 – The 1st National Negro Convention convenes in Philadelphia at Bethel Church with the purpose of abolishing slavery.

September 18, 1980 – Cosmonaut **Arnoldo Tamayo**, a Cuban, becomes the first Black to travel in space.

September 21, 1972 – **William L. Muckelroy** patents the leadless micro miniature inductance

element with closed magnetic circuit.

September 22, 1915 – HBCU Xavier University opens in New Orleans, LA.

September 28, 1965 – **Shannon L. Madison** patents a refrigeration apparatus device.

September 29, 1980 – The Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture opens in New York City.


BLACK HISTORY MAKER:



OTIS BOYKIN (1920 – 1982)

Otis Frank Boykin was born August 1920 in Nashville, TN. He graduated from Fisk University with a degree in Engineering. Otis worked at a radio station in Chicago, Illinois for many years. Later, he formed a company called Boykin-Furth, where he studied and tested electrical resistors. He also entered graduate school in Chicago and was soon forced to drop out because he lacked the funds to continue.

Despite having to leave school, Otis would not stop his competent inventiveness. He received his first patent of an electrical resistor in 1959 (pictured below). This invention allowed him to travel overseas, gain more customers in Paris and subsequently, the US. He returned to the United States in 1981 where he received another patent for the electrical capacitor. This invention helped commercial customers as well as military installations.



He was the first also to invent the circuit box for what we call the pacemaker (pictured below).

Tragically he died in 1982 of heart failure. Though he received little attention for his invention of the circuit box, his invention made a lasting contribution to the world. He will always be remembered as an inventor and pioneer in electrical engineering.


