"Your Impact on the Future of Nuclear Energy" -- Kevin Marsh, President and Chief Operating Officer, SCE&G

Kevin's speech covered three key areas: Financial, Regulatory, and Customer Service and Safety. He reminded us that all employees are impacted by VCS. "Everybody is important; everyone is part of the team." This is true whether you work at the plant or not.

- Financial "Know how your job adds to the bottom line."
- Regulatory Lots of resources are required to meet regulatory requirements that govern our industry.
- Customer Service and Safety All employees should be ambassadors for SCANA and "engaged in excellent customer service."

"Safety is First" -- Jeff Archie, Senior Vice President, Nuclear Operation, SCE&G



Jeff stressed the importance of safety and explained how all VCS employees "perform all tasks to the highest standards." Part of his presentation included a film about Three Mile Island and Chernobyl. It explained how the incidents occurred and how the fallout that resulted, ensures that nuclear energy is a more safe and efficient form of energy today. It armed us with knowledge that can be shared with neighbors and friends who may question us about the new construction.

"Nuclear – The Concern about Waste" -- Paul Mathena, Manager, Health Physics and Safety, SCE&G

Paul explained how radioactive waste from VCS is handled, stored, and shipped. He also spoke about the VCS Environmental Monitoring Program. Participants were empowered with the knowledge gained from his presentation.

"How to Align Yourself for a Career in Nuclear Energy" -- Scott McFarland, Manager, VCS Human Resources, SCE&G
