Mr. Farrell served as Dominion Energy's chairman and chief executive officer from 2007 to his retirement in 2020. He stepped down from chairman of Dominion Energy's Board of Directors effective April 1, 2021.

## **Learn More About Your Leadership Team**

During the first quarter, the Leadership team participated in several teambuilding activities to foster an effective collaborative environment. One was the Insights Discovery workshop. Insights, a tool designed to help individuals reflect upon themselves to identify personal traits and to better appreciate and value different approaches of others. The Discovery methodology uses a four-color model to help people understand their unique style, leadership strengths and weaknesses, and the value they bring to the team. Traits are broken down into color energies - Fiery Red, Sunshine Yellow, Earth Green, and Cool Blue energies - reflecting the strength in which each individual leads. The color energies determine how and why people behave the way they do.

Below are adjectives to describe each color's leadership approach.

- Fiery Red: purposeful, competitive, demanding, determined, strong-willed
- Sunshine Yellow: demonstrative, enthusiastic, persuasive, sociable, dynamic
- Earth Green: encouraging, caring, sharing, patient, relaxed
- Cool Blue: formal, precise, cautious, deliberate, questioning

# FIRST QUARTER GENERAL BODY MEETING: COVID-19 IMPACTS ON THE UTILITY INDUSTRY AND ITS WORKFORCE



On March 18th, AABE kicked off its first general body meeting of 2021 with Rear Admiral Aisha K. Mix, Assistant Surgeon General and Chief Nurse Officer with the U.S. Public Health Service. With the ongoing impacts of COVID-19, it was essential to share information around the virus, the symptoms, vaccine administration, and the effects on individuals, families, and especially within communities of color.

Rear Admiral Mix shared details of her role with the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps, one of the eight uniformed services solely committed to protecting the public's health. The organization consists of 6,000 public health professionals dedicated to addressing public health and providing clinical care. Rear Admiral Mix's in-depth analysis of the COVID-19 virus included reviewing its symptoms and how the virus is transmitted through respiratory droplets, contaminated objects, and surfaces, as well as outlined cases where no symptoms were shown. She compared those who were at risk of getting infected - those in close contact with an infected person, those who gather in large settings, and those who travel to high-risk areas - individuals who were at a high risk of becoming severally ill from the virus - mostly older adults and those with underlying medical conditions.

In addition to vaccine administration education and physical safety measures, Rear Admiral Mix discussed the importance of protecting one's mental stability. She advised AABE members in attendance to take breaks from the news, set goals and prioritize, focus on the facts - dispel the myths, connect with others, and take care of your body by eliminating stress and seeking professional help if needed.

The LIPP committee held its first event of the year March 31st, hosting a panel of experts as they discussed the state of energy equity in Virginia and how the proposed Percent of Income Payment Plan (PIPP) was working to level the playing field for eligible Virginians struggling to manage their energy costs.

The discussion covered the difference between equity and equality, how energy and equity are critically related, and the short - and long-term impacts of energy poverty on low-income consumers. Regarding the rollout of PIPP in Virginia, the panel covered the socialization of the costs of implementation, measures for success, and Ohio's implementation of the program. # National News: Michael Regan First Black Man in Lead EPA Administrator Role

On March 10th, the U.S. Senate confirmed Michael Regan in a 66-34 vote as the next administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). He will play a key role in the implementation of President Biden's climate agenda. He is the first black man second Black administrator at the EPA to lead the EPA. Regan has said he will fight for environmental justice, reducing pollution's disproportionate impact on people of color and communities living in poverty.



Formerly, Regan served as the secretary of North Carolina's Department of Environmental Quality. During that time, he launched the state's Environmental Justice and Equity Board to advise his role in advancing environmental justice and promoting community engagement, particularly in historically underserved and marginalized communities.

Regan attended the HBCU North Carolina A&T State University, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in earth and environmental science. He then went on to attend George Washington University, where he earned a Master of Public Administration. Regan will be the second Black administrator at the EPA, following Lisa Jackson, who led the Obama administration agency.

"Our priorities for the environment are clear: we will restore the role of science and transparency at EPA. We will support the dedicated and talented career officials. We will move with a sense of urgency on climate change, and we will stand up for environmental justice and equity,"
