### Former President of Virginia Chapter, Drexel Harris, Retires





#### PROGRAMS & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AT A GLANCE




On May 30th, AABE Virginia hosted Alleyn Harned of Virginia Clean Cities for the 2nd General Body Meeting. Virginia Clean Cities, a coalition that seeks to bring together both public and private stakeholders to cultivate an advanced transportation community and address the challenge of moving the country away from the dependence on imported petroleum towards energy independence. After the meeting, the chapter hosted Tesla and the Dominion Corporate Fleet for a hands-on display of electric vehicles.

# AABE VA Visits Dominion Energy's Cove Point Liquified

On June 21st, AABE Virginia hosted a tour of Dominion Energy's Cove Point Gas Liquefaction Facility. Located on the Chesapeake Bay in Lusby, Maryland, Cove Point is Dominion Energy's first liquified natural gas (LNG) export station and is the second of its kind in the country. Members received a brief presentation on the technology used at the facility, toured operations, and rode bicycles to the port where they were able to see a ship being filled with LNG to be transported overseas.





On June 12th, AABE Virginia partnered with Columbia Gas of Virginia's LEAD group, and Dominion Energy's Young Professionals and African American Resource groups for a professional development event featuring Dr. Jamelle Wilson - Dean, School of Professional and Continuing Studies, University of Richmond.
