Seven billion dollars is a lot of money except when it goes into infrastructure

Then, \$7bn, the sum that the US has committed to spend over the next five years on the Obama administration's newly-announced Power Africa initiative, does not sound like so much at all.

Even considering that Power Africa will roll out in only six countries (Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Nigeria and Tanzania), the project's funding feels slender.

Announced by President Obama himself during his recent Africa tour, Power Africa arrives with the pomp of a legacy-building initiative; measured against these industrial costs, it risks appearing tentative and small-bore, like much of the administration's Africa policy.

American Money: The Energy Sector Can't Grow Without You Will minorities get left behind as this industry moves forward? by BET News

Although growth in the energy sector continues to drive our economy forward, experts are concerned minorities might get left behind. Earlier this year, the American Association of Blacks in Energy's (AABE) Energy Policy Summit focused its discussions around increasing minority participation in the energy sector. While 40 percent of energy consumers are nonwhite, minority workers are still largely underrepresented in the industry, with very little corporate representation at the top.

One example of this disparity is in the solar industry, a growing source of job creation in the U.S. Data shows job growth in this field is six times the growth rate of the overall job market. Unfortunately women and people of color are not well represented in this growth.

The U.S. Energy Department is trying to close the gap with several programs that train and mentor minorities studying STEM fields, including a research program that helps fund development of affordable, solar technologies. The department also lists links to clean energy job databases you can search.

In a recent article, AABE Member Diedre Sanders explored the challenges and the opportunities for the energy industry as it confronts the issues surrounding the environmental impact on our community:

The Environmental Justice movement seeks to ensure that minority and low income communities are environmentally and economically sustainable. The movement arose when members of such communities concluded that their towns and neighborhoods were disproportionately likely to host high impact industrial land uses that, from their view, did not benefit their communities. Volt Energy Installs Largest Solar Energy Project at High-performing D.C. Charter School - KIPP DC

Volt Energy recently announced that 755 solar panels will be installed at **KIPP DC's Douglass Campus** located in the Anacostia neighborhood of Washington, D.C and is the city's most underserved area. Upon completion, KIPP DC will represent the



first charter school in the area to be run by a 227 kW solar energy system consisting of both solar carports and rooftop solar. Under a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA), KIPP DC will cut its electricity costs by purchasing solar electricity generated at a predetermined lower rate.

Over the life of the PPA, KIPP DC's Douglass Campus will eliminate more than 6,664 tons of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions, the equivalent of planting more than 33,456 trees or taking more than 13,382,400 car miles off the road.



"We are thrilled to partner with Volt Energy to bring solar power to our Douglass Campus. The Power Purchase Agreement will help us keep our energy costs down while allowing us to have a positive impact on the environment," said Alex Shawe, director of real estate, KIPP DC. "Even more exciting is the tremendous example we are setting for our students."

Volt Energy will work closely with KIPP DC staff to enhance the students' STEM based educational learning experience. This will include engaging students through interactive workshops detailing the benefits of renewable energy and discussing career opportunities in the energy sector.

"Volt Energy is proud to support this KIPP DC and the students at the Douglass Campus," said Gilbert G. Campbell III, co-owner, Volt Energy. "We believe this project serves as a catalyst to spark their interest in alternative energy, which is important as these are the very students who will one day be tasked with solving the world's complex energy challenges."

Volt Energy is the developer of the project and selected Green State Power to install the solar system that will be owned by Washington Gas Energy Services. The project is currently under construction and is slated to be completed by September 2013.
