# **Scoring**

Applications are rated on the seven categories listed below.

- 1. Scholastic Average
- 2. ACT/SAT Scores
- 3. Advanced Classes
- 4. Extracurricular Activities
- 5. Writing Abilities
- 6. STEM Majors\*
- 7. Ethnicity\*

The maximum points allotted on the rating scale is 100 points (bonus points not included)

# Scholastic Average

Points for Scholastic Average are given on a sliding scale, please see the allotments below. Grade point averages must be calculated on an unweighted 4.0 scale. If unweighted grades are not given, the application should not be accepted. No deviation from this scale is allowed. The maximum points allotted this section is 35 points.

Points for ACT and SAT scores are also given on a sliding scale, please see the allotments below. If the student has taken both the ACT and SAT, the highest score will be awarded. No deviation from this scale is allowed. The maximum points allotted this section is 20 points.

# Advanced Classes

Scoring for Honors, AP, IB and other Advanced classes is listed below. No deviation from this scale is allowed. The maximum points allotted this section is 8 points.

- > 1 to 3 classes is awarded 2 points
- > 4 to 5 classes is awarded 4 points
- > 6 or more classes is awarded 8 points

### Extracurricular Activities

Scoring for the amount of extracurricular activities a student has participated in is listed below. No deviation from this scale is allowed. The maximum points allotted this section is 12 points.

- ▶ 1 to 4 activities is allotted 7 points
- > 5 or more activities is allotted 12 points

# Writing Ability

Each applicant is to submit a 500 word or less essay that addresses: (1) Describe the repercussions of COVID-19 on your high school experience. Upon completing your degree, what are your plans to impact the energy industry? (2) Upon completing your degree, what are your plans to impact the energy industry?

This section is the only subjective section in the rating process. Each reviewer must read the essay submitted and rate three individual areas. Essays are rated on if the essay was energy related, the overall content, and the syntax of the essay. The maximum points allotted this section is 45 points.

- Energy-related content is awarded a maximum of 17 points
- Overall content is awarded a maximum of 16 points
- Syntax is awarded a maximum of 12 points

#### **STEM Majors**

Students pursuing STEM Majors are awarded 10 bonus points. A list of included majors is listed below. If the major is not listed, no extra points are to be awarded.
